Our Jury for the 23rd Great Northern Festival

Chairman of the Jury Howard Bagshaw MPAGB ARPS

Howard has been taking photographs for most of his life, but it was only when he retired, 11 years ago, that he found he had time to make AVs. It has been the story-telling aspect of AVs which has appealed most and many of his AVs have told stories with either a historical interest (*Migrant Mother, B.P., Menin Road*) or have resulted from Carole and Howard's travels (*The Land God Made in Anger, Colours of India, Suðursveit*).



He is a member of a number of photographic and AV clubs and is currently the Chairman of the RPS Audio Visual Group. He strongly believes that the camaraderie and shared support offered in AV clubs, makes the hobby particularly rewarding. Having started after the 'tape-slide' days, his work has all been in digital. He is envious of those who talk nostalgically of the 'string and pulley' days, however he is enthusiastic about the opportunities offered by the latest camera technologies and the potential of the software to branch out in different, exciting directions.

Having gained distinctions, both from the RPS and the PAGB for his AV work, he is now a member of the distinctions assessment panels of both organisations. He lectures in AV and camera clubs around the UK, but has also had the opportunity to talk to AV groups in Europe, South Africa and Australia, where he has also judged a number of International AV competitions.

I have been making AV sequences since 2004 but taking photographs as long as I can remember. I like the storytelling aspect of AVs and most of my sequences have a voice over. I have been greatly helped in developing my AV production skills by members of Leeds AV Group and am just entering my second period of Hon Secretary of the group. I have also been chair of the selection panel for the group for several years.

I am also the RPS organiser of the 'Great Yorkshire' AV days, a role I have undertaken for 10 years, initially

at Bradford Media Museum and now at Leeds Trinity University.

I have been on the judging panels for the Great Northern and the Peter Coles International AV Competitions and have had some success in national competitions but never higher than 'highly commended'!

In judging a sequence I expect the photography and soundtrack to be technically good, but an award winning AV is one with a gripping storyline that holds the audience's attention throughout.

I look forward to seeing many such AVs.

Andy was still in shorts when he started printing in his father's darkroom and photography, photographs, photographica have been a major part of his life ever since.

A past winner of The British Photography Competition it wasn't until moving to North Wales that he joined his one and only camera club, Mold, nearly 40 years ago where he is currently Vice-Chairman and External Competitions Secretary. There he found two like-minded young fellows, Chris Kay and Peter Wylde, who decided they would pool their equipment to produce twin-projector AVs - this was the birth of the

popular Pecriand and Son of Pecriand shows that visited clubs, Institutes and Halls in and around North Wales, the North West and the Midlands.

The visual side of Andy's interest in AV is clear from his achievements. The audio side stems from living in a musical family and a school where everyone had to learn a musical instrument. And so it was as a performer, in different musical genres on stage, that he learnt how to produce a 'show', surely what we are all trying to do. He believes that the audio aspect is as important, and should be as significantly different, as the images that have been used: it should be appropriate but singular and therein lies the skill.

Andy is currently working towards AV-AFIAP and his AVs have gained a number of awards in International and South African AV events but is struggling to find enough FIAP events in enough countries to get past 'halfway there'
