This was a revelation to me and I quickly got interested in developing my interest. I had won the Lincolnshire Photographic Association Annual competition for three consecutive years so I thought I would have a go a bit further afield. I managed to win the Pollock medal for first time entrant at the Great Northern Competition and also won the Worcestershire annual AV competition so this gave me further encouragement.

Always willing to put a little back, I became secretary of the RPS AV group, I have just completed two years as President of Lincolnshire Photographic Association (whilst running the website at the same time), and I regularly judge AV and still image in Lincolnshire. Bev and I have started to judge AV more widely recently including Midphot and the All Ireland AV Competition. I believe that photography and AV should be valued as an art form, and as an art form, it will often be impossible to judge totally objectively. I believe that the job of a judge is (yes to find some winners) but mainly to encourage everyone to develop their best work.

I have started entering National and International AV competitions with several mentions but the major titles have so far eluded me. In the last couple of years I have gained my ARPS and DPAGB/AV.

Bev has a similar passionate interest to me in AV and she contributes to the production process with her valuable insight into story, script, structure and narration. We spend a great deal of time discussing the merits of work which we view but we don't always agree! It has become our principal hobby.

I believe that we should have fun with our hobby, the most important people to please are ourselves. We should enjoy ourselves and if other people like our work, then that is a bonus!

This is a great hobby and an entertaining spectacle. I want to encourage everyone to have fun with our hobby!
